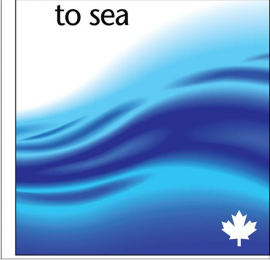

North Edmonton Church Plant

BACK GROUND

One of the fastest growing regions of the city of Edmonton is in the northeast. With the opening of the light rail transit (LRT) into this region, matched with inexpensive housing, the northeast has become a popular place to live. Unfortunately, there are few churches located in this region and there is a need for stronger kingdom presence.

MISSION

Beulah Alliance Church is a reproducing church with a mission to reach, teach and equip people to become fully devoted followers of Christ.

STRATEGY

Beulah Alliance Church will partner with local Alliance Churches to assist Rob Chartrand in the establishment of an independent viable, reproducing, self-sustaining church plant in northeast Edmonton. This church will create a local and regional gospel presence in the region north of Highway 16, east of 97th Street and west of 50th Street.

The goal will be to officially launch weekend services in the fall of 2010. Weekend services will include an effective children's ministry, worship and creative teaching.

PROJECT DETAILS

Relationships are the bed rock of any great partnership. This document is intended to serve upon the platform of existing relationships.

Description: Beulah will partner with regional Alliance churches and the Western Canadian District to launch a viable, reproducing church community in northeast Edmonton.

Target Demographic: In its initial phase, the church plant will target young adults and parents with young families, with a unique emphasis on second generation Canadians.

Project Status: The project has been approved by Beulah Alliance Church.

Timeline/dates: Support will be required from the District for a period of three years.

Partnership Opportunities - Regional churches can participate by:

- sending people to establish the core congregation and contribute to the ministry
- providing prayer support
- providing financial assistance for personnel: children's coordinator, administrative assistant and apprentice church planter
- providing resources such as A/V equipment, furniture, instruments, office equipment, computers, curriculum, and other resource needs
- providing financial assistance for significant start-up operational expenses, including web page design and community communications campaign
